The Safeguarding Team

At Sandwell Academy our Safeguarding Team consists of 4 members of staff: our Designated Safeguarding Lead, two deputy Designated Safeguarding Leads and a Family Support Worker. If you wish to raise a concern or have a query please use the email below. safeguarding@sandwellacademy.com

All Heads of Year are Level 3 Safeguarding trained and will also be able to help with any query. Each student is assigned a personal tutor and Pastoral Year lead; their contact details can be found on the school website.

At the Academy we offer a range of support for students through their Personal Tutor, school counselling, Mentors and the Inclusion Team. We also work with numerous agencies such as CAMHS, Sandwell Young Carers, Decca and Brooke. We have language support available if English is not your first language, and a Hearing impaired member of staff who offers sign language. Please contact your child's Personal Tutor or Head of Year for further information.

Operation encompass

Our school is signed up to Operation Encompass, the Sandwell Joint Agency Protocol for Domestic Abuse – notifications to Schools. This protocol sets out Sandwell's plans for a multi-agency operation to notify schools when a pupil has experienced domestic violence in their household, which will allow the school to provide appropriate early intervention and support in a timely manner.

Our DSL will receive notifications and ensure the children receive the right help at the right time. Additional support is available from Operation Encompass and provides an advice and helpline service for all staff members from educational settings who may be concerned about children who have experienced domestic abuse.

Early Help Assessment

The Early Help Assessment (previously known as CAF) is an assessment of the child / young person within the context of the family and community. It is not a comprehensive, core or specialist assessment and provides the opportunity for practitioners and the family to gain a better initial understanding of the child / young person's needs.

An Early Help Assessment:

- Helps identify the child or young person's needs.
- Provides structure for recording information.
- Can support referrals to other services.
- Provides a common form of assessment which will be familiar across children and young people's services.
