

Message from the Headteacher

New T Levels – combine studies with 'on-the-job' learning

We are very pleased to be one of only a few schools in the Country who have been selected to offer T Levels, the new technical courses which are being launched in 2020. The 2 year T Level courses have been developed in collaboration with employers and businesses to help students gain the skills and knowledge needed to open the door to highly skilled employment, a higher apprenticeship or higher level study. T Levels will combine classroom theory, practical learning and a three month industry placement with an employer to make sure that the students have real experience of the workplace. The course will take two years to complete, offering a technical alternative to A Levels. Around 80% of the time will be spent at Sandwell Academy with the remaining 20% being spent at the work placement. This differs to an Apprenticeship, which is typically 80% on-the-job and 20% in the classroom. In September 2020 Sandwell Academy is planning to offer the Digital T Level. Alongside specialist teaching at the Academy, the industry placement will be a key part of the programme. Experience with a real employer in a real workplace will allow students to apply the skills and knowledge they learn in the classroom to the job, giving them a taste of the world of work that they can expect once they have competed their studies. This will give them the opportunity to develop the employability skills they need for their chosen career. Employer Activities this term

During this Autumn Term there have been a variety of employer engagement activities taking place, some at the Academy and others off-site. Here are a few examples of the organisations that have been involved in a wide range of trips and projects.

Liberty House Group – an Industrial and Metals Company founded in the United Kingdom in 1992 by industrialist Sanjeev Gupta.

Year 10 students were involved in a 10 week STEM-based project collaborating with Liberty - Accles & Pollock Limited which is internationally renowned for metal tubing and machining processes. The Go For Set Challenge gave students an outstanding opportunity to liaise with experienced professionals, tackling real-life problems within the Liberty Factory in Oldbury. By the end of the programme the students had developed their employability, project management and critical thinking skills.

PwC (*PricewaterhouseCoopers*) - a multinational professional services network headquartered in London, United Kingdom. PwC ranks as the second largest professional services firm in the world

The PwC Roadshow visited the Academy to speak to the Sixth Form students about the organisation, the variety of roles available and opportunities within the Professional Service sector. The ambassadors shared their own career paths to date and gave an insight to their day to day working life. The students left the session with a greater understanding of the professional services sector and its application processes.





BAM – a Construction, Property and Civil Engineering Firm, as well as working in Public-private partnerships.

BAM continue to support Academy students in a variety of ways including mock interviews, dragons den activities and work experience placements. Students took part in a local community project to design and decorate a Christmas Grotto that could be moved to various sites as required. The project involved talking to various site staff and learning to use power tools. The feedback from students was that they had enjoyed the project and looked forward to presenting the finished grotto to the centre.
