This is an exciting time within the department entering into the Summer Term as we continue to work closely with our Year 10; Year 12 students and business partners to secure high quality work placements this Summer. The Team are also working tenaciously to ensure that every student that leaves the Academy moves on to a positive destination, whether that be a university, sixth form or apprenticeship. Our first recipient of the Employer Charter, Tesco received their award in October 2018 and we now have a further five to present. Recent Employer Activities

During the academic year there have been a variety of employer engagement activities taking place, some at the Academy and others off-site. Here are a few examples of the organisations that have been involved in a wide range of trips and projects:

BMW

Following a talk at the Academy by BMW about their apprenticeship programme, a group of students who are considering a career in engineering visited the plant at Oxford. The group were given a tour of the factory, an opportunity to speak to current apprentices and some hints and tips on the application process. The students found the visit useful and they gained a better understanding of the opportunities available and when and how to apply. BMW are continuing to develop this link to grow a talent pool of students who are interested in becoming their workforce of the future.



Lloyds Banking Group & University of Birmingham

A group of Year 9 students took part in a Digital Skills day held at the University of Birmingham run by staff from Lloyds Banking Group. The aim of the day was to look at the school curriculum and put a digital twist on the subjects using social media and online apps. The students had to present their ideas and findings to the whole group. The students left the day with a different view of their curriculum subjects and how they are used on a daily basis. Local branches continue to support our students with work experience placements and mock interviews, which helps them to build their network of students and meet their CSR objectives.



International Women's Day - *IWD is celebrated on 8 March every year. It is a focal point in the movement for women's rights.*

A group of Year 12 students celebrated IWD this year by inviting female employees from a range of organisations into the Academy to share their career pathway and their experiences. The roles included a Senior Occupational Therapist, RAF Avionics Technician, Educational Psychologist, Project Manager in the power industry, Care Manager and a MEICA Manager in the water industry. The students left with a greater understanding of each of the roles and a new network of contacts for any future questions.

Dodd Group regularly work with the Academy students, taking part in a number of activities, to aid with the 'world of work' including assisting with the preparation of a careers advice pack, delivering a Social Media workshop with Year 12, employability boot camp for Year 13 students, mock interviews and supporting the MNA STEM project working with a group of Year 9 students. Also annually host a number of students for the Work Experience fortnight

How long have you been involved with Sandwell Academy? For 2 to 3 years personally, but the company has done work for the Academy before.

Why do you and your organisation get involved? We try to offer work experience, careers support and advice. With the current skills gap and the war for talent, we have untapped potential on our doorstep. We have already identified and are working with one of the students – who will be joining us as an apprentice following the completion of the final school year.

What do think are the benefits for students and your organisation? For the students, we hope it is an opportunity to see what 'real work' is like! To get an idea of what is expected, what to do and say at interviews, how to present themselves and how what they do now can affect them and their futures. Dodd are committed to supporting the workforce of the future and the more youngsters we can encourage – especially encourage into STEM related activates the better for our industry.
