Provider Access Policy

Introduction

This policy statement sets out the Academy's arrangements for managing the access of providers to students at the Academy for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the Academy's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997 and in conjunction with current GDPR regulations.

Student entitlement

All students in Years 8-13 are entitled:
